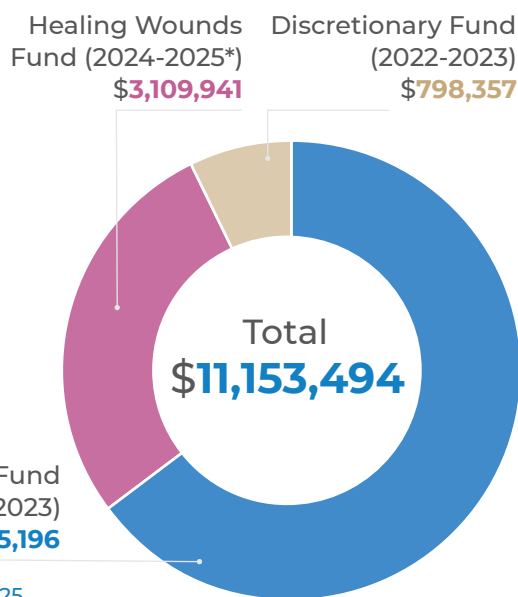

## Who are we?

The Healing of Wounds of the War in Ukraine Fund was established in January 2024 by the Ukrainian Catholic Metropolia's four Eparchies (Dioceses) in the United States: The Archeparchy of Philadelphia, the Eparchy of Stamford, the Eparchy of Saint Nicholas (Chicago), and the Eparchy of Saint Josaphat (Parma). The HWF is a continuation of the humanitarian efforts of the Ukrainian Catholic Metropolia in the United States, which has contributed over **\$11.2 million\*** through three different funds established since Russia's brutal invasion of Ukraine.

## The Fund's mission

The HWF supports projects that address the physical, mental, and spiritual consequences of the war waged against Ukraine. The Fund seeks to respond quickly to the urgent needs of our beneficiaries showing our solidarity and Christian love to our brothers and sisters in Ukraine.
