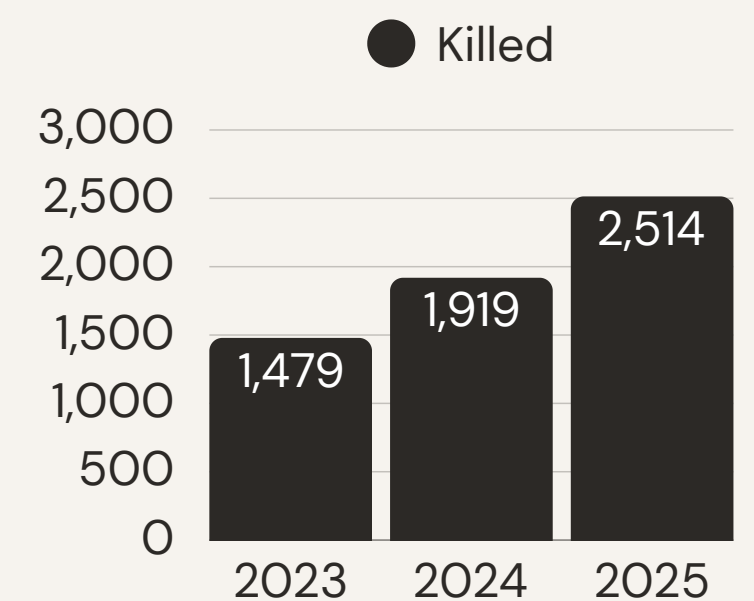
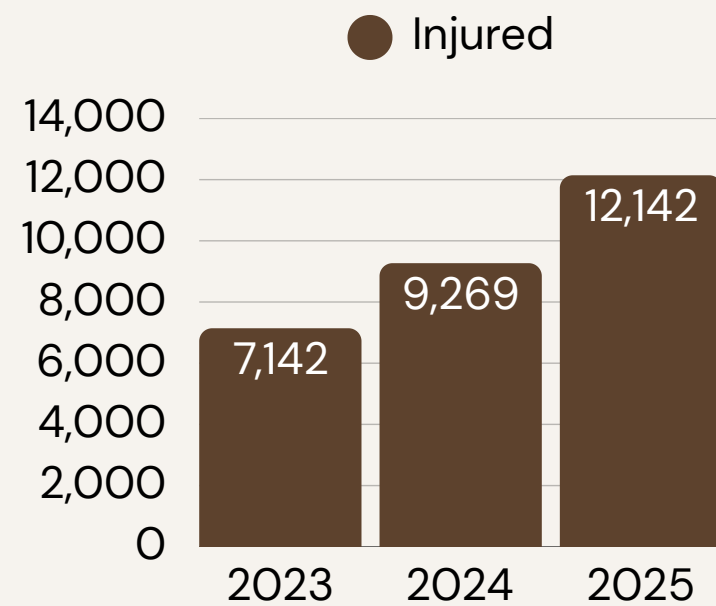

# CONSEQUENCES OF RUSSIAN ATTACKS ON ENERGY INFRASTRUCTURE

Russia has attacked Ukraine's energy facilities **more than 4,500 times** since the beginning of 2025.

**More than 160** energy sector workers have been killed since the start of the full-scale war.

Overall, more than **3,000** buildings in Kyiv remain without heating.

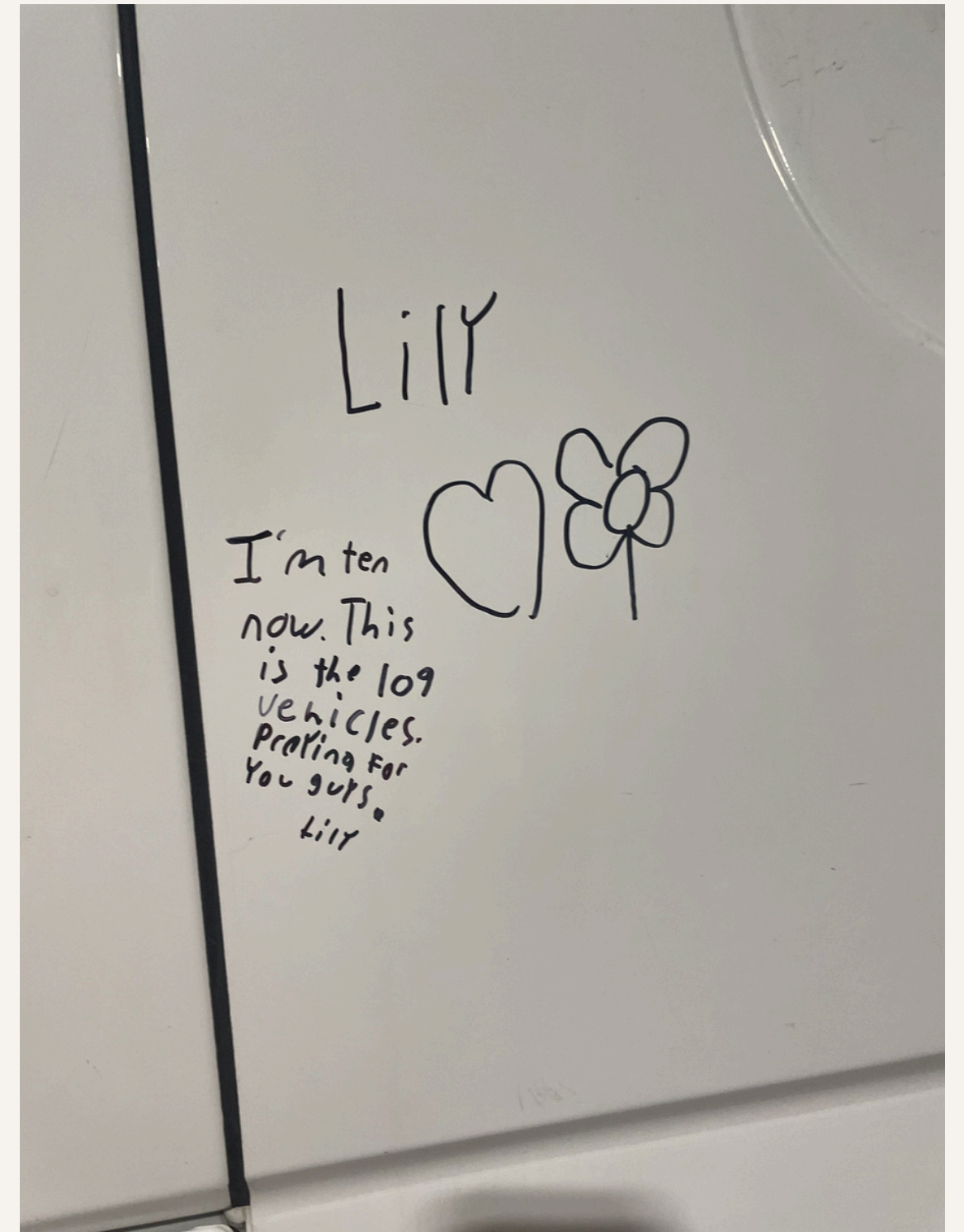

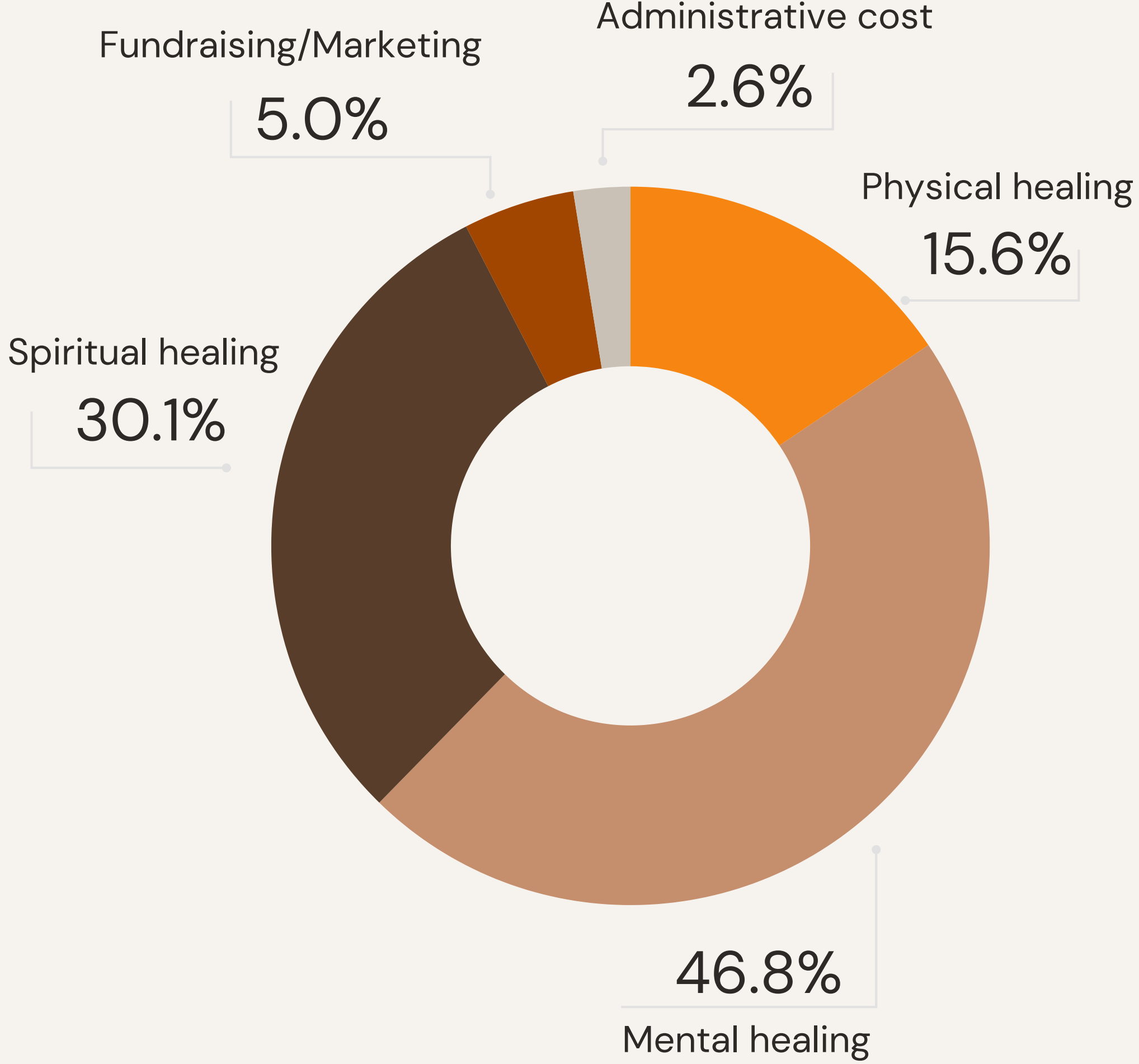




# FUND DISTRIBUTION IN 2025

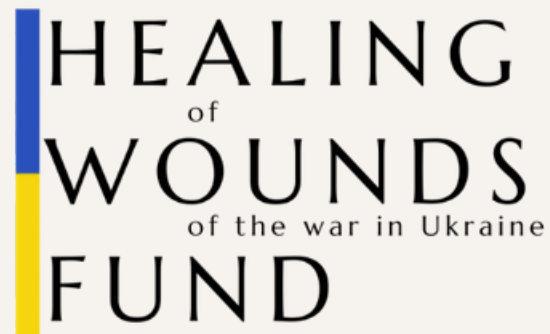
